

Have you been following along with YERC activities over the last couple of years and thinking 'this is great, but I want to get involved and make it even better'? Then this is your chance.

Current committee terms end at the end of December 2023. In the next couple of weeks we will be opening a call for applicants to join the new YERC committee starting in January 2024. Applications will be open until **November 10th** to give you a chance to meet us at the ERC congress to discuss the positions, and to get your application ready. The committee will be made up of 15 persons, from a range of backgrounds/disciplines and will work closely together over the next 2 years to take YERC into its next phase. 




